<b>ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS</b>	
1. Forty-two hours of upper-division business courses (3000-4000-level) are required. 2. No more than 18 hours of 3000-4000-level finance courses beyond 3303 can be taken to count toward the required 122 hours. 3. 3000-level core courses must be completed to enroll in 4000-level business courses.
