Courses for the minor may not be taken Pass/No Pass.</p> <p>Students must successfully complete at least 18 hours of coursework, including at least nine (9) hours at the upper-division level.</p> <p><b><i>No single course may be used by a student to satisfy a major requirement and a minor requirement.</i></b> A course may be used, however, to satisfy both a major support requirement and a minor requirement.</p> <p>Requests to substitute a minor requirement must be approved in writing by the Latina/o/x Studies program.</p> <p>A grade of C or better must be earned in each course submitted for minor credit.</p> <p><b>The College of Arts and Sciences language requirement must be met with Spanish.</b></p>
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Minors in the College of Arts & Sciences are available to all undergraduate students at OU. If the minor is officially declared, successfully completed, and noted on the graduation application, the student's transcript will so indicate at the time the bachelor's degree is posted.
