GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OTHER THAN COURSE REQUIREMENTS.
3. Candidates for the B.B.A. degree must complete their last 30 hours as resident students in Price College. However, if a candidate has completed the last 51 hours as a resident student at the University of Oklahoma, 9 of the last 60 hours may be taken at another university or by correspondence from OU.
4. Pass/No Pass WILL NOT be accepted for any Business or General Education courses or any specifically required courses.
5. One upper-division course in each of the following areas is required: FIN, L S, MGT, and MKT.
6. Sixty hours, excluding physical education activity courses, must be taken at a baccalaureate degree-granting institution.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS
1. A minimum of 43 hours of upper-division business courses (3000-4000-level) are required.
2. 3000-level core courses must be completed to enroll in 4000-level business courses.
