Or, the student may elect to receive advanced standing credit for the class piano course(s). See the Coordinator for Group Piano for information. BMA piano majors must take MUTE 1332 and MUTE 1342, Functional Piano Skills I and II, rather than Group Piano I - IV.
[‡] BMA piano majors must take MUTE 3110, Studio Accompanying for Piano Majors as a small ensemble experience for two semesters in the third and fourth year of piano major study.
