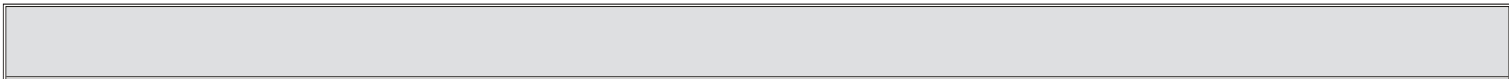

REQUIRED COURSES		
<p>Reading proficiency in in one foreign language as determined by the department is required.</p> <p>Core Courses (12 hours): Courses must be taken at the 5000 or 6000 level. ENGL 5403, Issues in CRL ENGL 5113, Teaching College Composition and Literature ENGL 5313, Literary Criticism and Theory One course in History of Rhetoric or Composition Theory as approved by the Graduate Liaison and the student's advisor:</p> <hr style="width: 20%; margin-left: 0;"/> <p>Electives (12-18 hours): Thesis: Four courses Non-thesis: six courses Courses must be 5000/6000 level courses in the department, but with approval, a substitution of one 4000 level graduate course OR one graduate course outside the department OR one directed reading will be permitted.</p> <p>Required Courses (2-6 hours): <u>Thesis:</u> ENGL 5980, Research for Master's Thesis ENGL 5960, Directed Readings OR <u>Non-Thesis (Terminal MA):</u> ENGL 5960, Directed Readings in Research Directed Reading required in conjunction with comprehensive exam.</p>	<p>3</p> <p>3</p> <p>3</p> <p>3</p> <p>12-18</p> <p>3</p> <p>3</p> <p>3</p> <p>2</p>	<p>The master's degree requires the equivalent of at least two semesters of satisfactory graduate work and additional work as may be prescribed for the degree.</p> <p>All coursework applied to the master's degree must carry graduate credit.</p> <p>Master's degree programs which require a thesis consist of at least 30 credit hours. All non-thesis master's degree programs require at least 32 credit hours.</p> <p>Credit transferred from other institutions must meet specific criteria and is subject to certain limitations.</p> <p>Courses completed through correspondence study may <i>not</i> be applied to the master's degree.</p> <p>To qualify for a graduate degree, students must achieve an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher in the degree program coursework and in all resident graduate coursework attempted. A student must also have at least a 3.0 in all coursework (including undergraduate coursework if any).</p>

A student who has done satisfactory graduate work and has earned a 3.0 grade point average may file for master's candidacy.
