<p>Required Courses (9 hours):</p> <p>HES 5523, Health Promotion Strategies, 3 HES 5563, Health Behavior I 3 HES 5553, Health Promotion Evaluation 3</p> <p>Core Courses (12 hours):</p> <p><i>Research Technology:</i></p> <p>HES 5953, Research Methods in Health and Exercise Science 3 HES 5963, Statistical Applications in Health and Exercise Science (or approved substitute) 3</p> <p><i>Thesis:</i></p> <p>HES 5980, Research for Master's Thesis 6</p> <p>Electives: 9 hours of coursework selected in consultation with the student's adviser and committee. 9</p>	<p>The master's degree requires the equivalent of at least two semesters of satisfactory graduate work and additional work as may be prescribed for the degree.</p> <p>All coursework applied to the master's degree must carry graduate credit.</p> <p>Master's degree programs which require a thesis consist of at least 30 credit hours. All non-thesis master's degree programs require at least 32 credit hours. Credit transferred from other institutions must meet specific criteria and is subject to certain limitations.</p> <p>Courses completed through correspondence study may <i>not</i> be applied to the master's degree.</p> <p>To qualify for a graduate degree, students must achieve an overall grade point average of 3.0 or higher in the degree program coursework and in all resident graduate coursework attempted. A student must also have at least a 3.0 in all coursework (including undergraduate coursework if any).</p>

A student who has done satisfactory graduate work and has earned a 3.0 grade point average may file for master's candidacy.
