#### ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

1. One upper-division course in each of the following areas is required: FIN, LS, MGT, and MKT.
2. Pass/No Pass **WILL NOT** be accepted for any Business or General Education courses or any specifically required courses.
3. Students must complete the GMAT exam with a score of 500 or greater.
4. Comprehensive written exam required at end of program.
5. Sixty hours, excluding physical education activity courses, must be taken at a baccalaureate degree-granting institution.

#### University-Wide General Education Requirements (minimum 40 hours)

Courses designated as Core I, II, III, IV, or Capstone are part of the General Education curriculum. Students must complete a minimum of 40 hours of General Education courses, chosen from the approved list, including at least one upper-division Gen. Ed. course outside of the student's major. Courses graded S/U or P/NP will not apply.
